Redstone Arsenal has served for more than 50 years as the Army's center for missile and rocket programs. An outstanding web site to view Redstone's history is located at the weblink above.

The U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command (AMCOM) headquartered at Redstone Arsenal is a major subordinate command of the U.S. Army Materiel Command. In partnership with supported Program Executive Offices and program managers, AMCOM develops, acquires, and fields Army aviation and missile systems. The Command serves as the "Army's sustainment manager," keeping supported systems ready to fight.

A significant number of AMCOM's 10,600 civilian workers and 300 soldiers work on missiles, rockets and aviation systems, and the supporting equipment required to operate them. To provide and sustain its systems, AMCOM conducts research, development, engineering and testing, both in laboratories and on test ranges.

AMCOM's Aviation and Missile Research, Development and Engineering Center operates distinctive facilities that include a unique simulation capability to evaluate missile components, such as seekers, over and over again in a variety of flight and countermeasures environments.

Most of the Command's soldiers and civilians are based at Redstone Arsenal. Civilian workers typically live in North Alabama communities within a 40-mile radius of Redstone.

The U.S. Army Garrison - Redstone Arsenal supports all the organizations on the Arsenal. It oversees the entire Arsenal, providing quality, cost effective base operations support to its customers, tenants, and DOD and federal activities in the vicinity of the installation.

Many of the Army commands and agencies listed below are tenants of the Arsenal while others are located in Cummings Research Park, north of the Arsenal. Redstone Arsenal has a number of

community support activities that serve tenant organizations and a population of nearly 99,000 retired military personnel and their families who live in the commuting area.

The U.S. Army Ordnance Munitions and Electronics School (OMEMS) is a U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command school and has graduated more than 190,000 students since it began operations in 1952. Today, the OMEMS team of more than 1,102 military and civilian personnel conducts and supports 101 courses of instruction and currently trains 6,000 soldiers annually. In conjunction with the 59th Ordnance Brigade, OMEMS consists of two battalions, the 832d Ordnance Battalion of Redstone Arsenal and the 73d Ordnance Battalion at Fort Gordon, Georgia. In addition, there are three training departments with three training detachments at other locations: PATRIOT, Fort Bliss, Texas; Explosive Ordnance Disposal Detachment, Eglin Air Force Base, Florida; and Field Artillery Radar Systems Electronic Repair in Fort Sill, Oklahoma. The noncommissioned officers' training course at the NCO Academy conducts basic and advanced NCO courses throughout the year.

The Logistic Support Activity (LOGSA) is an Army Materiel Command (AMC) separate reporting activity dedicated to providing world-class integrated logistics information and support for America's Warfighters.

The U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense Command (SMDC) serves as the Army service component to the U.S. Strategic Command and is part of the Army's 11 major commands (MACOM). Nearly half of the Command's 1,732 military and civilian personnel are located at its Huntsville facility.

The Program Executive Office (PEO) Air and Missile Defense (AMD) was established in July 1992 and is headquartered in Huntsville, Alabama with a field office in Washington D.C. The mission of the PEO AMD is to develop, integrate, acquire, and field quality air and missile defense systems. The PEO Aviation was established in 1987 to streamline aircraft acquisitions and to report directly to the Army Acquisition Executive.

The original arsenal combined two adjoining arsenals into one post in 1941 to make conventional ammunition and toxic chemicals during World War II. First designated the home of Army missiles in 1948, Redstone dropped from a peak WW II

employment of more than 19,000 to a little used post of a few hundred workers. Because of the large available space, empty buildings, and ease of access to rail, highway, and water traffic, the Army chose Redstone as the place to consolidate its newly formed rocket program. During the 1950s, the Army missile team at Redstone pioneered many of the nation's first achievements in space exploration. Redstone Arsenal earned a reputation for excellence in the areas of developing and supporting technology advancements in weaponry and in providing an outstanding work environment. In 1993, the Army chose Redstone Arsenal as the top medium sized post in the United States. It has been a finalist for five years in the annual competition to select the Army Community of Excellence.

Redstone Arsenal's 38,248 acres are bordered by Huntsville, Alabama, on the north and east with the Tennessee River forming Redstone's southern boundary. Huntsville is located in the northwest area of Alabama. Access to recreation opportunities and services is easy and convenient in Huntsville, a town of 171,000. Local attractions will keep your family busy while you can also enjoy the ease of traveling to other metropolitan areas such as Birmingham, Alabama (100 miles), Atlanta, Georgia (246 miles), Chattanooga, Tennessee (103 miles), Nashville, Tennessee (125 miles), and Memphis, Tennessee (216 miles).

REPORTING IN

Individuals should sign in at their assigned unit prior to reporting to inprocessing. If you are assigned to the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command, check in with Headquarters and Headquarters Company, AMCOM, U.S. Army Garrison Redstone Arsenal, in Building 3206, Little John Road. The staff duty officer may be reached Monday through Friday during business hours at (256) 876-7797 or DSN 746-7797.

If you are assigned to the U.S. Army Ordnance Munitions and Electronics Maintenance School, 59th Ordnance Brigade as a permanent party, check in at Building 3300. If you are a student, check in at Battalion S-1 in Building 3458. During holidays and weekends, both permanent party and students should check in at Building 3300. The staff duty officer may be reached at (256) 876-7381 or DSN 746-7381.

Whether you are military or a Department of Defense civilian employee, you can request a welcome packet by contacting Army Community Service (ACS) at (256) 876-5397 or DSN 746-5397. Welcome packets

are also available through written request or stopping by ACS during regular business hours. ACS is located at Building 3338, Redeye Road, Redstone Arsenal, 35898.

TELEPHONE INFORMATION:

Area Code is 256 for commercial numbers. DSN numbers are 746 for numbers starting with 876; 788 for numbers starting with 842; 645 for numbers starting with 955; 897 for numbers starting with 313.

With the potential for domestic and foreign terrorism, security is given high priority at Redstone Arsenal. Gate guards are posted around sections of the installation. Proper vehicle registration and individual identification are required. Photography and access are limited or prohibited in marked areas. When in doubt, contact the Public Affairs Office at 876-4161, bldg 5300. If you spot suspicious behavior, contact the Military Police at 876-2222.

The speed limit on the arsenal ranges from 10 miles per hour when passing troops to 45 miles per hour. All speed limits are posted and violations result in fines.

Visitor's Pass/Identification Badges (Redstone Arsenal, Alabama)

Visitor's passes and identification badges are issued at the Registration and Identification Office, Bldg 3423, Gray Road. All vehicles operated at Redstone Arsenal and firearms on Redstone Arsenal must be registered at the Registration and Identification Office. For more information, call 876-5770.

SECURITY BADGES --

All permanent employees assigned to Redstone Arsenal are required to wear a security badge. Personnel assigned for less than one year should check on current procedures by calling 876-5770. OMMCS personnel should contact OMMCS Security, Bldg 3467. To obtain a security badge, AMSMI-RA Form 1116, dated 1 Jul 96, must be completely filled out, signed by an individual authorized for the assigned organization, and presented at Bldg 3423. There may be alternate sites available, so it is advisable to check with the administrative/security office of your organization or call the badging office at 876-5770.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION --

On post vehicle registration -- Permanent personnel including civilian employees and contractors are required to register their vehicle on Redstone Arsenal. It is required that personal information and a videoimage be entered in the automated database. Documents required are: a security badge or military identification card; valid driver's license; and proof of ownership (tag receipt, bill of sale, or title). For more information, contact 876-5770.

Off post vehicle registration -- Active duty military personnel and their family members with valid vehicle registration from their original state need not register their vehicles in the state of Alabama. Newcomers who are not active duty military or their family members have 30 days upon establishing residency to change their out-of-state vehicle registration. To register your vehicle, you must submit a certificate of title, vehicle registration, and possibly a bill of sale to the License Commissioner's Office on the first floor of the Madison County Courthouse or one of the satellite offices listed in the driver's license section between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Alabama license tags may be renewed at the satellite offices. For more information, call 532-3310.

DRIVER'S LICENSE --

Military personnel and their family members with valid driver's licenses from their original state need not obtain Alabama license while the sponsor is on active duty. Retired military and their family members and civilian employees have 30 days after they establish residency to obtain a driver's license. The application process in Huntsville is administered only at the Department of Examiners at 1115A Church Street from 8 a.m. - noon, 1-5 p.m. M-F. The phone number is 539-0681. The test is \$5 (cash) and the license is \$23. Without a valid license, the newcomer must take vision, written and driving tests.

Renewing Alabama licenses and automobile tags can be done at any of the courthouse satellite offices. The satellite offices are at Food World on Bailey Cove and Weatherly Road, and Park Place Mall on Memorial Parkway and Drake, Huntsville, and Food World & Pharmacy on Highway 72 and Wall-Triana in Madison; and in the city hall of New Hope.

Newcomers have 30 days after establishing residency to change their out-of-state driver's license to valid Alabama licenses, or if moving within state, to record their new address. Active duty military and family members are not required to acquire an Alabama license as long as their current driving license is valid and unexpired.

To apply for an Alabama license, go to the Madison County License Department at 1115-A Church Street. Those moving in from out of state must present a valid driver's license, birth certificate, passport, military identification card, voter registration, or school record. Newcomers taking the Alabama driver's test must take a vision test and present a certified document of identification. The test is \$5 (cash) and the license is \$23. Without a valid license, newcomers must take the vision test, written and driving tests. Those under 19 years of age applying for a learner's permit must have a certified birth certificate, a school enrollment form, and a Social Security card. For more information, call 539-0681.

BOAT REGISTRATION --

All boats operating in Alabama waterways must be registered with the state. When you apply for an Alabama driver's license, you may also request a boat operator's license. Persons operating without boat licenses will be fined if caught.

HUNTING/FISHING LICENSES --

Various combinations of hunting/fishing licenses are required. Contact Outdoor Recreation, building 5132, Sportsman Drive, or call 876-4869 between 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., seven days a week, to purchase a license meeting your needs.

SCHOOL INFORMATION --

Redstone Arsenal does not have Department of Defense schools on post. If you are in government housing, your child(ren) will attend Williams Elementary, Williams Technology Middle School on a space available basis, Westlawn Middle School, and Butler High School, which are all operated under the Huntsville City School System. Area schools include Madison City School and Madison County Schools.

HIGH SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

The Alabama State Board of Education requires that any student receiving a high school diploma must pass all sections of the Alabama High School Basic Skills Exit Exam and fulfill state and local requirements regarding Carnegie units.

Implemented for the 2001 school year, the five-subject test challenges students with questions roughly equal to an 11-th grade level. As a result, the passing scores are not set as high.

Students have to answer 59 percent correctly to pass the 84-question reading section and the 100-question language section. On math and science sections, students must answer 44 out of 100 questions correctly. The social studies score has not been set yet.

Since the new graduation exam was implemented for the 2001 school year, seniors must pass only the reading and language portions. In 2002, seniors will have to pass the reading, language, math and science sections. In 2003, seniors will have to pass all five sections.

Students will see the test in the spring of their sophomore year and take it again as juniors in the fall and spring. Seniors will have multiple chances to take it during their senior year. Once a student acs a section, he/she need not take it again.

Graduation requirements are 24 credits with four credits each required in English, math, science and social studies to obtain a regular diploma. An advanced diploma has the same basic requirements except students need two years of a foreign language and four years of advanced English, advanced math, advanced science and advanced social studies.

An alternative diploma is for students who pass their entire course, but who did not pass the exit exam. Students must pass the GED.

Occupational diploma is presented to special education students who completed separate curriculum standards designed for competitive employment.

All six of Madison County's high schools are on the four-period day format or "block" schedule. Students take four major subjects and two electives each semester in 96-minute classes. The switch was the result of the new state high school graduation standards that require students to have 24 credits. Under the four-period schedule, students can earn up to 32 credits with more options. For more

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

To enter kindergarten, students must be 5 years old on or before September 1 to enroll in Huntsville City Schools and September 1 to enroll in county schools. To enter first grade, students must be 6 years old on or before September 1 in the Huntsville City Schools and in Madison County Schools. Huntsville City School registration forms are available through its web site (see Detail/Record Listing below.)

Kindergarten through 12th grade students in Alabama must have a valid Social Security number and card.

When you register your child for school, you will need a certified copy of the child's birth certificate for kindergarten and first-grade children and a certificate of immunizations or a certificate of exemption from immunization. Entering kindergarten and 6th graders must present a certificate showing that a second dose of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) has been received. All students entering Huntsville City Schools for the first time must present official evidence of a second MMR.

You will need the name and address of the former school if the student is transferring from another school system.

Military families may obtain a copy of the Alabama immunization card at Fox Army Health Clinic when they arrive. You need to drop off the child's yellow shot records or medical records showing your child has received the immunizations.

The post health clinic offers immunization clinics before school starts. Call 955-8888 for more information on how to obtain an immunization card. HINT: Most day schools require an original blue shot card for their records. If you have a child that needs to be enrolled in a day care and will be attending school, you may want to request two copies from the health clinic.

Immunizations are also available for free from the Madison County Health Department, 304 Eustis Avenue or call 539-3711.

In Huntsville, proof of residence (a signed lease, deed, mortgage, or letter from the property manager) and a utility or phone bill addressed to the parent or guardian at the address being established as the residence is required.

The pupil must attend the school in the zone in which the legal residence of the parent(s) who has legal custody of the pupil is located, unless otherwise assigned by the Superintendent. If it is determined that the pupil is out of zone and has falsified information, the pupil will be required to adjust immediately. Credit will not be given to students who violate this policy. Students moving to another school zone within the city of Huntsville during the school year may elect to complete the year in the school they have been attending or move to the school serving their residential area.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Under federal law, all public school systems must serve students with physical and learning disabilities from ages 3 through 21. For evaluation and enrollment, contact Huntsville City Schools Special Education Office at 428-6800; Madison County Schools Special Education Office at 852-2557; or Madison City Schools Special Education Office at 464-8370.

More information about special education is included in the separate special education section of SITES.

To enroll a family member in the Exceptional Family Member Program, contact the EFMP Manager, Army Community Service at 876-5397.

Child Find is a statewide program sponsored by the state Department of Education's Division of Special Education Services. Child Find locates, identifies, and evaluates individuals from birth to age 21 who have disabilities or who are suspected of having disabilities. Call the school district, EFMP Manager or 1-800-543-3098 for more information.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Some schools offer after school programs. Contact the school your child will be attending for information about these programs. Some programs offer homework assistance, snacks, and after school supervision. HIGH SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

The Alabama State Board of Education requires that any student receiving a high school diploma must pass all sections of the Alabama High School Basic Skills Exit Exam and fulfill state and local requirements regarding Carnegie units.

Implemented for the 2001 school year, the five-subject test challenges students with questions roughly equal to an 11-th grade level. As a result, the passing scores are not set as high.

Students have to answer 59 percent correctly to pass the 84-question reading section and the 100-question language section. On math and science sections, students must answer 44 out of 100 questions correctly. The social studies score has not been set yet.

Since the new graduation exam was implemented for the 2001 school year, seniors must pass only the reading and language portions. In 2002, seniors will have to pass the reading, language, math and science sections. In 2003, seniors will have to pass all five sections.

Students will see the test in the spring of their sophomore year and take it again as juniors in the fall and spring. Seniors will have multiple chances to take it during their senior year. Once a student aces a section, he/she need not take it again.

Graduation requirements are 24 credits with four credits each required in English, math, science and social studies to obtain a regular diploma. An advanced diploma has the same basic requirements except students need two years of a foreign language and four years of advanced English, advanced math, advanced science and advanced social studies.

An alternative diploma is for students who pass their entire course, but who did not pass the exit exam. Students must pass the GED.

Occupational diploma is presented to special education students who completed separate curriculum standards designed for competitive employment.

All six of Madison County's high schools are on the four-period day format or "block" schedule. Students take four major subjects and two electives each semester in 96-minute classes. The switch was the result of the new state high school graduation standards that require students to have 24 credits. Under the four-period schedule, students can earn up to 32 credits with more options. For more information about Huntsville City high schools schedule, call Pam Berry at 955-6309.

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

To enter kindergarten, students must be 5 years old on or before September 1 to enroll in Huntsville City Schools and September 1 to enroll in county schools. To enter first grade, students must be 6 years old on or before September 1 in the Huntsville City Schools and in Madison County Schools. Huntsville City School registration forms are available through its web site (see Detail/Record Listing below.)

Kindergarten through 12th grade students in Alabama must have a valid Social Security number and card.

When you register your child for school, you will need a certified copy of the child's birth certificate for kindergarten and first-grade children and a certificate of immunizations or a certificate of exemption from immunization. Entering kindergarten and 6th graders must present a certificate showing that a second dose of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) has been received. All students entering Huntsville City Schools for the first time must present official evidence of a second MMR.

You will need the name and address of the former school if the student is transferring from another school system.

Military families may obtain a copy of the Alabama immunization card at Fox Army Health Clinic when they arrive. You need to drop off the child's yellow shot records or medical records showing your child has received the immunizations.

The post health clinic offers immunization clinics before school starts. Call 955-8888 for more information on how to obtain an immunization card. HINT: Most day schools require an original blue shot card for their records. If you have a child that needs to be enrolled in a day care and will be attending school, you may want to request two copies from the health clinic.

Immunizations are also available for free from the Madison County Health Department, 304 Eustis Avenue or call 539-3711.

In Huntsville, proof of residence (a signed lease, deed, mortgage, or letter from the property manager) and a utility or phone bill addressed to the parent or guardian at the address being established as the residence is required.

The pupil must attend the school in the zone in which the legal residence of the parent(s) who has legal custody of the pupil is located, unless otherwise assigned by the Superintendent. If it is determined that the pupil is out of zone and has falsified information, the pupil will be required to adjust immediately. Credit will not be given to students who violate this policy. Students moving to another school zone within the city of Huntsville during the school year may elect to complete the year in the school they have been attending or move to the school serving their residential area.

MAGNET SCHOOLS

Under Alabama state law, academically gifted students are given special attention from kindergarten through 12th grade. For more information about Huntsville magnet schools, call 428-6800.

Academically gifted students can attend special classes during the school day while in elementary school. In upper grades, gifted students are offered advanced classes or opportunities to take courses at local colleges and universities.

NOTE: Families living on the arsenal may have limited eligibility to attend magnet schools. For more details, contact Army Community Service at 876-5397.

Huntsville City School's 14-year-old magnet school programs allow students to immerse themselves in special areas of interest from foreign languages to performing arts to science.

Children can enter magnet academies as early as kindergarten. The city school system provides busing from the child's home school.

More information about the magnet schools is included in the separate special education section of SITES.

SPORTS ELIGIBILITY

In Alabama, each school has zone lines that determine where each students attends. The zone lines are determined by the county or city school system that govern that particular school. The Alabama High School Athletic Association uses these zone lines to determine athletic eligibility. When a student transfer from one to to another school, he/she is not eligible to participate in athletics at the new school for a period of one year from the transfer date. There are exceptions to the transfer rule and these exceptions are found in the AHSAA handbook. Each principal and athletic director of all schools will have a handbook in the office.

To attend a school in Huntsville, one must live within the city limits of Huntsville. When newcomers move into Huntsville, the children are enrolled in the public school he/she is zoned for or any of the private schools that are physically located within the city limits of Huntsville. The child will be eligible for sports immediately if he/she is enrolled in the school serviced by the area and meets the academic requirements.

For more information about the AHSAA and other athletic eligibility rules, please contact the web site or the principal of the school where you will attend can give you all the information.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Under federal law, all public school systems must serve students with physical and learning disabilities from ages 3 through 21. For evaluation and enrollment, contact Huntsville City Schools Special Education Office at 428-6800; Madison County Schools Special Education Office at 852-2557; or Madison City Schools Special Education Office at 464-8370.

To enroll a family member in the Exceptional Family Member Program, contact the EFMP Manager, Army Community Service at 876-5397.

Child Find is a statewide program sponsored by the state Department of Education's Division of Special Education Services. Child Find locates, identifies, and evaluates individuals from birth to age 21 who

have disabilities or who are suspected of having disabilities. Call the school district, EFMP Manager or 1-800-543-3098 for more information.

SCHOOL HOURS

Huntsville City School building will not be open before 7:30 a.m. School officials ask parents not to send children to school before this time, as there are no certified personnel on duty. Class begins at 8 a.m. Elementary students must leave the premises at 2:30 p.m. Middle school students must leave the premises at 3 p.m. High school students are required to leave campus at 3:15 p.m. Magnet school hours vary. Students should inquire and adhere to the designated times.

EXTENDED DAY CARE

Public and DODDS Schools

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SCHOOL REPORT CARD

The Alabama State Board of Education posts a school report card for each school in Alabama, for more information the web link is below. The report card rates the academic performance and includes information on such areas as staffing, safety and discipline, student academic performance, number of students eligible for free or reduced priced meals, and more.

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) gives soldiers a means of identifying family members with physical, emotional, or intellectual handicaps, so that assignment authorities may give special consideration to reassigning service members to locations where their family members can receive appropriate treatments or programs. If your family member has special educational needs, please contact the EFMP Manager at Army Community Service, Building 3491, Honest John or call 876-5397.

Redstone Arsenal has a Youth Educations Support Services Director whom can assist you with your educational needs at 955-6309. The YESS office is located in Bldg 1500. The program coordinates various committees and partnership efforts between Redstone Arsenal, area schools, and youth agencies to improve the quality of life for military children.

Huntsville City Schools are based on a neighborhood system, which means your child will attend the school zoned for your neighborhood. If you are buying a house, the realtor should inform you about which schools the area is zoned. If you live in an apartment or the realtor is unsure, contact the School Zone office at 532-4684 for city schools and 852-7073 for county schools.

TRANSPORTATION

For all residents of Redstone Arsenal, AMCOM has a bus contractor that will transport children to and from the three schools serving Redstone Arsenal. To register or for more information, call 876-5866/3938. The county school system provides busing for children who live five miles away from the school. For more information about county school busing, call 852-7073.

If you live off post, the Army does not have the requirement to provide transportation and bus support is extremely limited so parents will have to make transportation arrangements for their children. For working parents, most schools offer an extended day or after school program for elementary school children. Fees start around \$25 a week per child and include homework help, an after-school snack, and

enrichment activities. Tutoring services may be available for additional fees.

Child and Youth Services at Redstone Arsenal offer an outstanding before and after school program, winter camp, spring camp and summer camp program. Contact Central Registry at 876-3704 for more details.

Huntsville City Schools do not have morning programs for children. The schools open at 8 a.m. The children are allowed on the school grounds before 8 a.m., but are unsupervised. If you want your child supervised, you will have to enroll the child in an extended day program at a day care center or YMCA. Before enrolling your child in an after school program, be sure that the program will transport your child to and from the school. Not all schools offer an after school program so check with the school.

STANFORD ACHIEVEMENT TEST (SAT)

The results of the Stanford Achievement Test are listed for the individual schools. The SAT compares students' performance in reading, mathematics, language, science, and social science with a national sampling of same-age scores. The national average is the 50th percentile. The battery score listed is the average score, calculated from the total scores earned by that grade in each subject.

MAGNET SCHOOLS

Under Alabama state law, academically gifted students are given special attention from kindergarten through 12th grade. For more information about Huntsville magnet schools, call 532-4849.

Academically gifted students can attend special classes during the school day while in elementary school. In upper grades, gifted students are offered advanced classes or opportunities to take courses at local colleges and universities.

Huntsville City School's 15-year-old magnet school programs allow students to immerse themselves in special areas of interest from foreign languages to performing arts to science.

For the two high school programs, all students are eligible. However, only white students at majority white schools or African-American students at majority black schools are eligible to attend full-time. Students in the racial minority at their home schools

are eligible to attend high school magnet programs part-time.

insurance plans. To be eligible for TFMDP enrollment, sponsors must intend to remain on active duty for at least 24 months and this commitment must be confirmed by their parent Uniformed Service. Enrollment and/or changes to enrollment can be accomplished by filling out a DD Form 2494 or 2494-1 at the sponsor's servicing personnel office. Please read these forms carefully as they provide detailed information on enrollment options, limitations, and when TFMDP coverage begins. Upon enrollment, the sponsor must pay the monthly premium through their Uniformed Services payroll account - the Government pays 60% of monthly premiums. Before providing care to family members, some dental providers may ask to see a copy of the sponsor's Leave and Earnings Statement showing the dental plan payroll deduction. The Madison County School System's 18,000 students are educated in 21 schools at the elementary, middle and high school levels.

Students enrolling in either the Huntsville City School System or Madison County School System should provide immunization records, a Social Security number, a certified birth certificate, two proofs of residence such as a utility bill and lease or mortgage, and preferably their last school report card or unofficial transcript. Registration is handled at the school the student will attend. For more information, contact the Huntsville City School System at 532-4684 or the Madison County School System at 852-7073.

Parents with older children should acquire numerical grades in addition to alphabetical grades from the last school attended when registering with the Alabama school system.

The Army Community Service Education Committee serves as your liaison between the military family and the school system. The goal of the Education Committee is to advise the schools on the needs of military children, and to represent their interests. If you need help, or if you would like to participate, call 876-5397 to speak to a representative.

Parents who need high school graduation transcripts from Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DODDS) can obtain copies by calling (703) 696-1414 for information. To request transcripts, parents can write "Education Testing Service, DODDS, P.O. Box 6605, Princeton NJ 08541-0001." They need to include the student's name, school attended, year graduated, and a \$3.50 check or money order (no cash).

DRESS CODES

Area schools prohibit clothing deemed by school administrators as either too tight, too loose, too revealing, too short or too long. Backpacks must be mesh or clear material. Coats and other outdoor garments are to be worn only outside, when inside, the garments must be stored in a student's locker.

Huntsville City Schools dress code rules:

1. Clothing that displays antisocial, immoral or illegal behavior is not allowed. Any article of clothing, jewelry, or haircut depicting gangs, satanic occult, violence, sex, drugs, alcohol, mutilation or language that could be considered obscene or vulgar will not be allowed.

2. Jewelry that could be used as a weapon is not allowed.

*3. All shorts/skorts, skirts and dresses must approach knee length. Slits in skirts and dresses must not be extreme or revealing.

*4. If so designed, shirts and blouses must be tucked in pants and/or skirts. Oversized tops may not be worn below the waist.

5. Except for religious purposes, hats and head coverings may not be worn in school buildings.

6. Sunglasses, gloves, bandanas, and house slippers may not be worn in school buildings.

7. Bib overalls and/or suspenders must be snapped, hooked and/or buttoned and kept on shoulders. Belts must be buckled.

8. Pants may not be oversized, too tight, or allowed to sag. Undergarments must not be exposed. Pant legs must be uniform length and may not drag on the floor.

9. Revealing tops, spandex, or clinging garments are not permitted.

Any student in violation of the dress code will be required to change. Time missed from classes will be unexcused (students must make-up work missed). Disregard for the dress code will lead to disciplinary action, in accordance with the Huntsville City Schools Official Student/Parent Handbook.

* Elementary principals are urged to use discretion according to student age and size.

The final decision regarding dress will rest with the building principal or his/her designee.

Take full advantage of the programs at your ACS. The programs are set up to ease the transition stress.

Before You Move

Any Permanent Change of Station (PCS) move is going to cost money. Experts say 3-6 months pay in reserve will cover moving expenses and emergencies amply. Expenses for families are going to be higher than for singles. If you are a dual income family, you may not have that second income for quite some time while your spouse prepares for the move and then tries to find a job at the new duty station. Contact the Army Community Service (ACS) Consumer Affairs/Financial Assistance Program (CAFAP) for information on setting up a budget or revising your current budget.

Contact the ACS Relocation Assistance Program at your losing post to request a Standard Installation Topic Exchange Service (SITES) packet (it is what you are holding in your hand right now), request a welcome packet from your gaining installation or just to ask any questions that might have come up about moving.

If necessary, make billeting reservations ahead of time at your new duty station. You can call 1-800-GO-ARMY1 (1-800-462-7691) to make billeting arrangements worldwide.

Find out your new mailing address, even if it is only the mailroom at your new unit.

Request a sponsor through the Military Personnel Office at your losing installation by filling out a DA Form 5434. Sponsors provide accurate, timely information and other support needed to minimize problems associated with relocating to a new duty station.

Make a list of every business you have been paying bills to such as the utility company, telephone company, landlord, etc. and include their name, addresses, telephone and account numbers. Send out change of address cards to credit card companies, loan companies, magazines, banks, insurance companies, and anyone who owes you money or a deposit refund.

Handcarry important papers such as military records, ID cards, wills, household inventories, school records or health records. Remember, the box you ship those papers in will be the one that gets lost first or unpacked last.

Go through your household goods, if you haven't used an item in the last year, you probably don't need it. (This advice does not apply to maternity clothes and baby items. The old superstition is when you get rid of those, you will probably need them again.) You have to pay shipping if your weight allowance is over, you have to unpack it and then get rid of it at your next duty station. Reduce your stress level and get rid of the extra items before you move.

After You Arrive

Check in with Redstone Arsenal Army Community Service (ACS) when you arrive. We have area maps, information about schools, tourist attractions, child care and more. Your spouse can start their search for employment or consider volunteering with ACS (We offer free child care) or Army Family Team Building.

ACS offers a Newcomers' Orientation six times a year in February, April, June, August, October, and December. Attendance is mandatory for all permanently assigned military. Spouses are encouraged to attend since the orientation features speakers, information booths and a bus tour of Redstone. Free child care is provided at the Child Development Center.

Checking In

If you are assigned to the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command, check in with Headquarters and Headquarters Company, AMCOM, U.S. Army Garrison Redstone Arsenal, in Building 3437. The staff duty officer may be reached Monday through Friday during business hours at (256) 876-7797 or DSN 746-7797.

If you are assigned to the U.S. Army Ordnance Munitions and Electronics Maintenance School, 59th Ordnance Brigade as a permanent party, check in at Building 3300. If you are a student, check in at Battalion S-1 in Building 3458. During holidays and weekends, both permanent party and students should check in at Building 3300. The staff duty officer may be reached at (256) 876-7381 or DSN 746-7381.

Whether you are military or a Department of Defense civilian employee, you can request a welcome packet by contacting Army Community Service (ACS) at (256) 876-5397 or DSN 746-5397. Welcome packets are also available through written request or stopping by ACS during regular business hours. ACS is
